Candidates' positions on the issues are determined using recorded votes for and against legislation; statements from interviews, press appearances, press releases and candidate events; social media posts from verified accounts; and endorsements from organizations and associations.

**Champion:** This candidate has led legislative efforts addressing the issue, including introducing and/or co-sponsoring legislation; created an organization or association dedicated to supporting the issue; and/or made the issue stance a cornerstone of their campaign on their website or in speeches.

**Support:** A candidate is considered in support of an issue area if they have shown support for the majority of policies within the issue area.

**Unknown position:** We could not find a record of a clear policy position from this candidate during our research.

**Opposes:** A candidate is considered in opposition to an issue area if they have shown opposition for the majority of policies within the issue area.

## Raphael Warnock - U.S. Senate

#### Family economic security

- Make millionaires and billionaires pay their fair share of taxes
  - » Tweeted against tax breaks for the wealthy
  - » Warnock <u>supported the amendment</u> to the Inflation Act to exempt some businesses from the 15% minimum tax on corporations
  - » On Warnock's campaign <u>website</u>, he says "Fighting for workers also means Reverend Warnock will oppose Washington tax breaks that benefit the richest of the rich while leaving behind the poor and working families that need help the most."
- Help families with the rising cost of child care by investing in high-quality, affordable child care.
  - » Signed a letter with other Senators calling to address child care in reconciliation
- Establish universal paid family and medical leave.
  - » Cosponsored <u>S.248</u> FAMILY Act, which "entitles every employee to a family and medical leave insurance (FMLI) monthly benefit payment of two-thirds of the employee's regular pay, limited to a maximum of \$4,000, for not more than 60 days of qualified caregiving"
  - » <u>Tweeted</u> in support of #PaidLeaveForAll
- Protect women, especially women of color, and others from discrimination and harassment in the workplace
  - » Research into this candidate has yielded no statements indicating support or opposition
- Pay workers fairly, including ensuring equal pay for all and raising the minimum wage to at least \$15/hour for all working people.
  - » Original cosponsor on <u>S.53</u> Raise the Wage Act of 2021, which "increases the federal minimum wage for regular employees over a 5-year period, for tipped employees, and for newly hired employees who are less than 20 years old"
  - » <u>Tweeted in support</u> of raising the federal minimum wage

## Abortion

- Codify the right to abortion in-state and support the creation of a nationwide right that stops abortion bans and guarantees that the right and access to abortion does not depend on where a person lives.
  - » From his Senate web page: "Warnock has fought to increase safe and affordable access to contraceptives and achieve reproductive justice for women and families. At a moment in which Roe v. Wade is under attack like never before, Reverend Warnock is fighting to ensure that all Georgians have access to the health care they need, including reproductive health care. As a prochoice pastor, he fundamentally believes that health care is a human right and that decisions about pregnancy should be made between a patient and their doctor."
  - » He has tweeted support for abortion as a right and as heath care
  - » Warnock was endorsed by NARAL
- Ensure that people's access to health care is free from stigma, barriers, and restrictions, including abortion care, contraceptives, and maternal health care.
  - » He has tweeted support for abortion as a <u>right</u> and as <u>heath care</u>
  - » Warnock was endorsed by NARAL

- Make sure quality pregnancy supports are accessible, affordable, and culturally competent for all including
  protections and supports, like doula access, are available that promote the health outcomes of Georgia's
  pregnant people, especially Black women.
  - » Co-sponsored <u>S.4550</u> to increase funding for pregnancy centers that provide equal counseling for all options, including adoption, abortion, pregnancy, and foster care
  - » Co-sponsored <u>S.3362</u>, requiring "the Department of Health and Human Services to implement a coordinated approach for monitoring and sharing information about its maternal health efforts"
- Safeguard and expand access to contraception.
  - » Co-sponsored <u>S.4612</u> "to protect a person's ability to access contraceptives and to engage in contraception, and to protect a health care provider's ability to provide contraceptives, contraception, and information related to contraception"

## Education

- Support students' ability to learn and be themselves by keeping them safe from discrimination and harassment in school.
  - » Co-sponsored the 2021 Equality Act, which prohibits discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity in areas including public accommodations and facilities, education, federal funding, employment, housing, credit, and the jury system. Specifically, the bill defines and includes sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity among the prohibited categories of discrimination or segregation.
    - The bill expands the definition of public accommodations to include places or establishments that provide (1) exhibitions, recreation, exercise, amusement, gatherings, or displays; (2) goods, services, or programs; and (3) transportation services.
- Oppose efforts to fuel divisions in our communities by vilifying and excluding transgender students.
  - » Along with other Senators, he <u>introduced a Senate resolution</u> recognizing the month of June as LGBTQ+ Pride Month
    - 'As we reflect on how far we have come, let's remember how far we have to go to create a world where we \*all\* feel safe to be our authentic selves. Every human being has inherent dignity, and I'll always be an ally of the LGBTQIA+ community,' said Senator Warnock."
  - » In 2020, Warnock wrote a piece for The Advocate in which he said "The same sort of religious fearmongering I'm fighting against, has shown up in the form of my opponent Kelly Loeffler who would rather spend her time pushing hateful bills to punish trans women athletes in schools for being themselves than to protect health care for nearly 400,000 LGBTQ Georgians."
  - » In September 2020, he tweeted in opposition to anti-transgender bills
- Oppose censorship of schools' ability to teach truth, including about race and gender and how they have been used to divide us
  - Warnock voted against a Senate amendment (S.Amdt. 3680) to a Senate Budget Resolution (S.Con. Res. 14) "to establish a deficit-neutral reserve fund relating to prohibiting the teaching of critical race theory in prekindergarten programs and elementary and secondary schools"

- Ensure full funding that meets every school's needs including schools building safer environments by prioritizing COVID safety measures.
  - » Voted <u>against</u> a Senate resolution "providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Health and Human Services relating to 'Vaccine and Mask Requirements To Mitigate the Spread of COVID-19 in Head Start Programs'"
- Advance gun safety measures that keep schools free from gun violence
  - » Giffords said in its <u>endorsement</u> "He is a champion for gun safety in the Senate, supporting legislation that would close loopholes in our gun laws that allow people who have committed domestic abuse to access firearms, require background checks on all gun sales, and secure funding for community violence initiatives and gun violence research"
  - » Voted in favor of bipartisan federal gun control legislation
- Oppose discriminatory discipline policies in schools, including increased policing of students
  - » <u>Tweeted</u> in support of Title IX protections

## **Democracy/SCOTUS**

- Protect and expand access to the ballot and restore the Voting Rights Act.
  - » Warnock <u>urged the Senate</u> to take up the John Lewis Voting Rights Act, saying (42:43) "If we fail to protect the voices and votes of the American people, then we have fallen way short of our responsibility as members of this body."
  - » In his first Senate floor <u>speech</u>, Warnock said " "I stand before you saying that this issue access to voting and preempting politicians' efforts to restrict voting is so fundamental to our democracy that it is too important to be held hostage by a Senate rule, especially one historically used to restrict the expansion of basic rights"
- Ensure all voters have equal access to the ballot box and their votes are counted fairly, including expanded early voting days, language access protections for Limited English Proficient (LEP) voters, and a district map that empowers all voters.
  - » Warnock was the primary sponsor of <u>S.2155</u> to protect elections. Among other things, the legislation "restricts the ability of a statewide election administrator to remove a local election administrator" and "establishes certain requirements for challenging an individual's eligibility to register to vote or vote in federal elections"
- Reshape the makeup of the judiciary by working with federal lawmakers to nominate and confirm judges with a strong record of supporting gender and racial justice issues and who affirmatively declare they will uphold equality, opportunity for all, individual liberty, and the freedom to make personal decisions about our bodies and relationships.
  - » Released a <u>statement</u> in support of the nomination of KBJ to SCOTUS, saying "I proudly support her nomination, and hope my colleagues will join me in voting for her confirmation"
  - » Tweeted in support of KBJ's confirmation

# Herschel Walker - U.S. Senate

#### Family economic security

- Make millionaires and billionaires pay their fair share of taxes
  - » In a radio <u>interview</u>, Walker said, "All I ever hear from the left is, 'Let's tax the wealthy, let's tax the wealthy.' Well, you can't just say, 'Let's tax the wealthy.' That's not that's not right. You gotta have a tax system that's gonna be fair for everyone," Walker said, arguing that America needs "leaders that's gonna make a decision, rather than just trying to push it off on something else."
- Help families with the rising cost of child care by investing in high-quality, affordable child care
  - » Walker has not commented on policies to expand access to high-quality, affordable child care and largely has barred press from his appearances.
- · Establish universal paid family and medical leave
  - » Research into this candidate has yielded no statements indicating support or opposition
    - Walker has not explicitly addressed universal paid leave but consistently talks about removing government red tape for businesses on his campaign <u>website</u> and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.
- Protect women, especially women of color, and others from discrimination and harassment in the workplace.
  - Walker has not commented on policies to protect women and others from discrimination and harassment and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.
- Pay workers fairly, including ensuring equal pay for all and raising the minimum wage to at least \$15/hour for all working people
  - » Walker has not commented on raising the minimum wage and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances

#### Abortion

- Codify the right to abortion in-state and support the creation of a nationwide right that stops abortion bans and guarantees that the right and access to abortion does not depend on where a person lives.
  - » In the aftermath of the Dobbs decision, he <u>Tweeted</u> his support for overturning Roe
- Ensure that people's access to health care is free from stigma, barriers, and restrictions, including abortion care, contraceptives, and maternal health care.
  - » Quote from <u>NYT</u> article: Asked Wednesday if he wanted a more total ban on abortion than the sixweek prohibition passed by the Republican-controlled state legislature, Mr. Walker was unequivocal. "There's no exception in my mind," he told reporters after a campaign speech in Macon, Ga., at the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame. "Like I say, I believe in life. I believe in life." He did not single out exceptions for rape, incest or the life of the mother specifically, but he said repeatedly that he wanted no exceptions.
  - » His campaign <u>website</u> claims: "Herschel is a compassionate conservative who is pro-life and profamily."

- Make sure quality pregnancy supports are accessible, affordable, and culturally competent for all including
  protections and supports, like doula access, are available that promote the health outcomes of Georgia's
  pregnant people, especially Black women.
  - » Walker has not commented on ensuring quality pregnancy supports and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.
- Safeguard and expand access to contraception
  - » Walker has not commented on contraception and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.

# Education

- Support students' ability to learn and be themselves by keeping them safe from discrimination and harassment in school.
  - » Walker has not commented on keeping students safe from discrimination and harassment and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.
- Oppose efforts to fuel divisions in our communities by vilifying and excluding transgender students.
  - » Walker told <u>Newsmax</u>: he doesn't "think it was "fair" for transgender athletes to participate in female sports, as 'men shouldn't be in women's sports. It is sad that right now we're trying to determine what is a woman,' Walker, R-Ga., said on National Report. 'It's written in the Bible what's a woman ... you have two [sexes], there's a man and a woman, and that's it.' The GOP candidate further said that he doesn't "know who decided to let that happen" when it comes to transgender athletes competing in women's sports, but now, "they're threatening if you speak out against it," but "Herschel Walker is going to speak out against it."
  - » In March, he <u>tweeted</u> his outrage that a transgender woman had won an NCAA swimming competition
- Oppose censorship of schools' ability to teach truth, including about race and gender and how they have been used to divide us.
  - » Walker told <u>Newsmax</u>: he doesn't "think it was "fair" for transgender athletes to participate in female sports, as 'men shouldn't be in women's sports. It is sad that right now we're trying to determine what is a woman,' Walker, R-Ga., said on National Report. 'It's written in the Bible what's a woman ... you have two [sexes], there's a man and a woman, and that's it.' The GOP candidate further said that he doesn't "know who decided to let that happen" when it comes to transgender athletes competing in women's sports, but now, "they're threatening if you speak out against it," but "Herschel Walker is going to speak out against it."
- Safeguard students' ability to live full, dignified lives free from gun violence
  - » Walker gave a pro-gun response to the Uvalde shooting
- Oppose discriminatory discipline policies in schools, including increased policing of students
  - » Walker has not commented on school discipline policies and largely has <u>barred</u> press from his appearances.
- Ensure full funding that meets every school's needs including schools building safer environments by prioritizing COVID safety measures.

- » Research into this candidate has yielded no statements indicating support or opposition
- » Walker <u>said</u> "I'd encourage every Georgian to reach out to your doctor and have that conversation," he said, "and make the decision that is best for you and your family."

## Education

- Protect and expand access to the ballot and restore the Voting Rights Act.
  - » When asked about the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act, Walker said "You know what's sad about that—to use the name of a great man to brand something that is so bad, I think it is terrible to do. Senator Lewis was one of the greatest senators that's ever been and for African Americans that was absolutely incredible. To throw his name on a bill for voting rights I think is a shame." He added it "just doesn't fit what John Lewis stood for, and I think [Democrats] know that. And I think that it's sad for them to do this to him."
- Ensure all voters have equal access to the ballot box and their votes are counted fairly, including expanded early voting days, language access protections for Limited English Proficient (LEP) voters, and a district map that empowers all voters.
  - » In the same interview, he said "[L]et's go to the voting rights, if you want to talk about voting. First of all, if you want to get people to vote, if they're legal to vote, you want to try to encourage people to vote that's the most precious thing that you have not encourage, but encourage. And what I mean by that is, you get things done now don't talk about it after or talk about it during, but get it done right now. And no one is not legal to vote, why don't we go in and get the IDs and get everything done right now instead of waiting until it's time to vote and start talking about it. And I think that's what people got to remember."
- Reshape the makeup of the judiciary by working with federal lawmakers to nominate and confirm judges with a strong record of supporting gender and racial justice issues and who affirmatively declare they will uphold equality, opportunity for all, individual liberty, and the freedom to make personal decisions about our bodies and relationships.
  - » Walker released a <u>statement</u> saying "I would not have voted to confirm Judge Jackson to the Supreme Court," said Herschel Walker. "Her record has shown her to be lenient on criminals, supportive of Critical Race Theory, and open to court packing. We need Supreme Court justices who will uphold the U.S. Constitution – not advocate for progressive policies from the bench."
